Figure 1: Our international partners





The team has *inter alia*: undertaken due diligence assessments/ analyses and provided technical and policy support services to clients on a range of projects in many developing countries. We have also assisted project developers to gain access to the carbon market by preparing their projects to generate carbon credits under various schemes, including the CDM and have developed and manage two CDM Programmes of Activity (PoAs) providing developers with business and technical support through all processes related to the generation, issuance and sale of carbon credits.

The team has assisted many government agencies, academic institutions, NGOs and businesses in developing countries through the processes of general awareness-raising, and reviews of capacity needs and project opportunities.

We have, in addition, provided advisory and consulting services, *inter alia* to the European Union and the Austrian, Portuguese and Swedish governments in climate policy development, the development of the CDM mechanism and related project identification, and been project developers and/ or experts for several UN agencies (e.g. ADB, UNFCCC, IPCC, World Bank, UNIDO, UNEP, UNDP), other agencies (e.g. REEEP, Stockholm Environment Institute, IETA, CTI), and educational institutions (Chalmers University of Technology, Lund University, the Swedish Foundation for Strategic Environmental Research, and the Institute for the Rational Use of Energy in Stuttgart).

Our team members have been active in numerous countries in the Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, and in Eastern Europe. We have successfully managed our own energy, environmental and carbon consultancy companies for many years.

We have extensive experience with energy efficiency and renewable energy projects, general and project-specific capacity building, information systems and network development and our cumulative experience represents over 100 years of work in the energy-environment-climate change-carbon market nexus. National donors

Carbonergy and partners have worked with many government donor agencies worldwide and have *inter alia* assisted Austrian, German, Japanese & Swedish clients to undertake due diligence and technical assessment of projects offered to them for financial support and to provide capacity development services to counterparts in developing countries.

Multilateral agencies

Much of the work undertaken by the team has been through technical assistance projects of UN bodies such as the ADB, World Bank, UNDP, UNIDO & the Global Environment Fund.

The team is closely affiliated with the UNFCCC and one partner in the team has served as a member of the CDM Executive Board. Carbonergy and its partners are also developers and reviewers of methodologies and have provided consultancy services to the UNFCCC Secretariat on the CDM process (establishing procedures for the CDM Registry and registration and issuance of carbon

credits (CERs)), as well as the equitable geographic distribution of CDM projects and the Nairobi Framework.

Private sector

The majority of the work however, has been assisting the private sector in the development & submission of energy-related projects, mostly renewable energy, as well as in facilitating the generation, sale & purchase of carbon credits from those projects.

The team has worked *inter alia* with: Standard Bank to support development of CDM components of their clients' projects in Africa; major corporate members of the Business Leader's Initiative on Climate Change (Sweden) to increase their CSR value through carbon footprinting, design and implementation of greenhouse-gas mitigation measures, and carbon offsetting; the private sector in the Philippines developing the RE2Grid Programme of Activities (PoA) in renewable energy. Carbonergy has also initiated a programme providing advice to private sector clients on the costs & benefits of installing solar PV (small- and medium-scale businesses and industry, resorts, residences) and, through engineering partners providing EPC and ESA services.

Regional Focus

Africa

The team has worked on the CDM in 26 sub-Sahara (Anglophone and Francophone) African countries since 1998. Much of the early work focused on creating awareness of the potential for CDM but, in the process, numerous CDM projects were sourced, reviewed and developed to various stages.

Our capacity building activities in Kenya and Tanzania reversed the focus, concentrating on developing CDM projects while 'mentoring' domestic project developers through to the stage of validation readiness. We are currently developing several CDM projects and assisting clients to develop new methodologies and grid emission factors in other countries of the region.

More recently, the team assisted the Nigerian government to address issues (policy, financial & institutional) related to market readiness for NAMAs.

Asia

The team has been similarly active on the CDM in ten Asian countries, including China, India and six in Southeast Asia.

Carbonergy BCS, located in the Philippines, is active in the renewable energy and carbon market there. With its partners, Carbonergy has recently worked for the World Bank in Mongolia assisting the DNA by advising on revisions to their earlier governance framework, structure & procedures. As a follow-up, Carbonergy and partners prepared a project proposal to assist in readying Mongolia for new carbon market mechanisms under a NAMA framework.

Work was also undertaken for KfW in India and the Philippines respectively looking into the market potential for energy efficiency measures in rice mills and hog farms under a CDM Programme of Activity (PoA). Comprehensive PINs were prepared in both cases.

Corporate clients have engaged Carbonergy and partners to include their hydropower and wind projects in the 'RE2Grid PoA' that was registered at the end of 2012 and discussions are ongoing with others interested in the potential of carbon credits from end-user solar PV installations which are being provided through Carbonergy.

In addition, Carbonergy recently initiated a solar PV programme for rooftop installations for small-(e.g. household), medium- (e.g. resorts), and large-scale (e.g. industry) clients in the Philippines, providing business, technology, and monitoring/ reporting advisory services. Our partners provide the engineering, procurement and construction services.

Latin America & the Caribbean

The consortium has been active in seven Latin America/ Caribbean countries so far and is now gearing up its work in the region through our partner company in Grenada (Carbon Finance Solutions) that has been working with CARICOM on various initiatives. In 2012, one of our partners registered an oil-sector PoA in Trinidad and Tobago, for which they will participate collaboratively with a local counterpart in the CME role.

Another partner registered three CDM projects in the sugar industry in Brazil (developed one of the first approved methodologies, designed and registered the projects) and negotiated the sale of carbon credits.

More recently, team members have assisted the government of Trinidad and Tobago through training on NAMA development, and development of an MRV system and were contracted to build capacity and enable investments in renewable energy and energy efficiency as part of supporting implementation of Caribbean NDCs.
